Imagine yourself a new mother coming home from the hospital with a newborn infant in your arms. You have walked to the hospital and given birth. Now you are walking home. And no one and nothing is waiting for you.

Humanitarian Action on Behalf of Children (HABC) is a project connected with IMAHelps (which organizes medical and surgical missions to many countries around the world) and the Nicaraguan Relief Society. The project's goal is to impact the infant mortality rate in Nicaragua through direct aid to mothers of newborns.

Come and hear Ligia Molina, Founder & Organizer of HABC, present on the topic of humanitarian action, the results of HABC's efforts on behalf of children, and what you can do to contribute.

Used baby clothes, a dozen cotton diapers, even receiving blankets can make a difference to a child's wellbeing.
