Welcome to the Rudolf Steiner School, Mbagathi, Nairobi – 20 kilometers south of Nairobi on the Masai plains. Here in Sub-Saharan Africa, where a vast majority of children have no access to primary education, the school serves 300 children Kindergarten to 8th grade. About a quarter are boarders; the remainder come daily from further afield.

Our featured speaker, **Leigh Adams** will share her experiences teaching at the Rudolph Steiner School. In addition to Nairobi, Leigh has taught art in Costa Rica, China, Baja, Kenya and locally. A National Endowment of the Arts Folk Artist of the Year nominee in 2009, 2010 & 2011, Leigh is currently Artist-in-Residence at the Los Angeles County Arboretum where she co-designed its first permaculture garden.

The Rudolph Steiner School develops the child's thinking (head), feelings (heart) and doing (hands), aiming to educate the whole child so that she grows up with the vitality and initiative to forge a new future.
