It is a non-governmental organization (NGO) of the United Nations in consultative status with UNESCO and the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). WCCI has organized the triennial World Conferences since 1974 until the world conference held in 2006 at Manila Hotel, Manila, Philippines when it became biennial conference. A founder suggested that the WCCI 16th World Conference should be held in California since WCCI originated in this state of the United States (1970) and the Secretariat is in San Diego. Furthermore, as we ponder on the theme of the conference, California is one state of the United States that leads in many movements that are directed and/or related to the Culture of Peace and the Care of Planet Earth. CALL FOR PAPERS, WORKSHOPS AND PANEL PRESENTATIONS

Paper sessions will be limited to 20 minutes with an additional 10 minutes for discussion. Workshop presentations will be limited to 90 minutes. Panel sessions will be limited to 90 minutes, in which three or more presenters will be given an opportunity to speak in an open forum. Strict time limits will be enforced for all the presentations.

1] Abstracts of 100 words or less should be submitted on or before **February 1, 2014**.

The one-page single-spaced abstract MUST include the following information.

- > Title of the Paper, Workshop and Panel Presentation
- > Name(s) of the lead presenter(s)
- > Position/Title
- > Institutional/Organizational affiliation
- Mailing address
- > Phone Number(s), fax number
- > E-mail address
- > Names of co-presenter(s) and/ or team members
- > A brief biography of presenter(s) and/co-presenter(s)
- > Brief description of the presentation (100 words or less). For workshops, please include content of workshop, workshop plan and timetable. Include no more than five keywords.

Please use the Presentation Paper Proposal form from the website at http://conference-wcci-international.org and use it to submit your paper proposal on-line. It is a MUST to use the form. Proposals not in the proper form will not be reviewed.

- 2] Acceptance letters of accepted paper proposals will be mailed or e-mailed by **March 1, 2014**. All abstracts will be peer reviewed.
- 3] At least one presenter (per group) must register for the conference by the Early Bird registration deadline (May 31, 2014) to ensure inclusion of the presentation in the Conference Program. Without valid registration, presentation cannot be included in the Conference Program.
- 4] A maximum of two proposals may be submitted for review. However, only ONE will be accepted for presentation and the author(s) must make a commitment to present it in person.
- 5] Electronic copy of the full paper must be submitted no later than **July 31, 2014**.
- **6**] Selected papers will be included in the conference proceedings.


